<b>Word</b>	<b>Definition</b>
<b>architecture</b>	<b>the art or practice of designing and building structures (especially habitable ones)</b>
<b>figure</b>	<b>a geometric form (as a line, triangle, or sphere) especially when considered as a set of geometrical elements (as points) in a space of a given number of dimensions</b>
<b>lecture</b>	<b>a talk given before an audience or class especially for instruction</b>
<b>measure</b>	<b>the dimensions, capacity, or amount of something ascertained by measuring</b>
<b>pasture</b>	<b>plants (as grass) grown for the feeding of grazing animals</b>
<b>picture</b>	<b>to form a mental image of : imagine</b>
<b>pressure</b>	<b>the weight or force that is produced when something presses or pushes against something else</b>
<b>structure</b>	<b>something (such as a house, tower, or bridge, etc.) that is built by putting parts together and that usually stands on its own</b>
<b>agriculture</b>	<b>the science or occupation of cultivating the soil, producing crops, and raising livestock</b>
<b>brochure</b>	<b>pamphlet, booklet; especially one containing descriptive or advertising material</b>
<b>culture</b>	<b>the act or process of cultivating living material (as bacteria or viruses) in prepared nutrient media; also a product of such cultivation</b>
<b>exposure</b>	<b>the condition of being unprotected especially from severe weather</b>
<b>impure</b>	<b>mixed with something else that is usually not as good, or containing something unclean</b>
<b>mixture</b>	<b>a physical combination of two or more substances that does not form a new substance</b>
<b>moisture</b>	<b>a small amount of liquid that causes moistness: dampness</b>
<b>procedure</b>	<b>the manner or method in which an action is carried out</b>
<b>pure</b>	<b>not mixed with anything else: free from everything that might make it dirty or lower the quality</b>

<b>structure</b>	<b>a physical feature or part of an organism</b>
<b>temperature</b>	<b>the degree of hotness or coldness of something (as air, water, or the body) as shown by a thermometer</b>
