

acreage

area measured in acres

cattle

domesticated, four-legged, bovine animals on a farm or ranch, held as property and raised for use

centuries

a unit of time equal to 100 years

emigrant

one who is departing or has departed from a country to settle elsewhere

ferry

a commercial service with terminals and boats for transporting persons, automobiles, etc., across a river or other comparatively small body of water

generations

those being a step in a line from one ancestor, or a group of individuals born and living at the same time

hometown

the city or town where one was born or grew up

immigrants

a person who comes to a country to take up permanent residence

microclimate

the essentially uniform climate of a usually small site or habitat

residents

someone who lives in a particular place
